

The R. L. White Ranch, located seven miles north of Helotes on the north side of Texas Highway 16, was once one of the largest ranches in northwest Bexar County. You will be greeted at the gate, and directed to follow the ranch road over steep hills with spectacular views the Hill Country. Positioned to impress guests with its size, the Lake Pavilion was designed in Texas Rustic-style architecture on a grand scale, patterned after the Grand Canyon Lodge at the North Rim of Grand Canyon National Park designed by Gilbert Stanley Underwood in 1927. Constructed by R.L. White in the 1930's, the Lake Pavillion served as a lodge and guest quarters for hunters visiting the ranch. The great Main Room consists of open vault supported by large logs forming its truss and beam work with opposing, oversized fireplaces located at either end of the building's enormous central room. Wrap around porches provide a lovely setting to enjoy views of the lake. Visitors are invited to arrive early and hike the ranch before sitting down to a delicious dinner of locally raised beef cooked to perfection on outdoor pits by the members of the San Geronimo Valley Alliance. Don't miss this chance to experience the Hill Country in the best Texas tradition.
